About the University sector

In 2010 the TEC funded eight universities, through Student Achievement component funding, for fewer than 2,000 to over 25,000 equivalent full-time student places.

Universities are expected to do more than teaching and learning; they also have an important research role. However, the performance information presented here does not include information about research.

The nature of enrolments at a specific university will influence its performance. For example, part-time and extra-mural students often have work or family commitments and cannot devote as much time and energy to their studies. They may also have different study goals. For example, Massey University has a large extra-mural roll.

An increase in enrolments in lengthy qualifications in 2010 may lower some TEOs' [qualification completion rate](#).

- Enable a wide range of students to successfully complete degree and postgraduate qualification
- Undertake internationally recognised research
- Create and share new knowledge that contributes to New Zealand's economic and social development and environmental management
