About the University sector

In 2013 the TEC allocated Student Achievement component funding to all eight universities, which funded from approximately 2700 to over 29,000 equivalent full-time students.

The nature of enrolments at a specific university will influence its performance. For example, part-time and extra-mural students often have work or family commitments and cannot devote as much time and energy to their studies. They may also have different study goals. For example, Massey University has a large extra-mural roll.

Lincoln University's results are not necessarily comparable to previous years given the merger of Lincoln University with Telford Rural Polytechnic on 1 November 2011.

In addition, the Canterbury earthquakes impacted on both Lincoln University and the University of Canterbury and decreases in enrolments can have flow on effects on qualification completion and retention, in particular.

Government expectations of the University sector

The government expects universities to:

- Enable a wide range of students to successfully complete degree and postgraduate qualification
- Undertake internationally recognised research
- Create and share new knowledge that contributes to New Zealand's economic and social development and environmental management.

Universities are expected to do more than teaching and learning; they also have an important research role. However, the performance information presented here does not include information about research.

Tertiary Education Strategy

The Tertiary Education Strategy (TES) sets high expectations for TEO performance and prioritises an outcomes focus especially for industry, Maori and Pasifika learners and at risk young people.
