Other Tertiary Education Providers are a small group of providers that offer a diverse range of education. In 2010, seven Other Tertiary Education Providers received Student Achievement Component funding.

The nature of enrolments at a specific Other Tertiary Education Provider will influence its performance. For example, part-time and extra-mural students often have work or family commitments and cannot devote as much time and energy to their studies and may have different study goals.

An increase in enrolments in lengthy qualifications in 2010 may lower some TEOs' <u>qualification completion rate</u>.

Other Tertiary Education Providers are currently treated as a separate organisation type. From 2011 onwards, the educational performance of Other Tertiary Education Providers will be reported in conjunction with Private Training Establishments.

Tertiary Education Strategy

The Tertiary Education Strategy calls for better performance from the tertiary education sector as well as raising achievment for all learners under 25, and for Māori and Pacific learners.


